A wonderfully romantic early Gothic Building with the aisles wrapping around the tower with its tall pinnacles, in the parkland of a big house surrounded by tall trees. The windows on the North side are filled with stonework - did the local Lord run out of money and could not afford glass? A curious place. Such a pity it was locked.

Under a 100m away is the National Trust shop and café where they collect £7.10 entrance to the Traditionally farmed estate and medieval manor house where you can listen for the deep croak of ravens and woodpeckers tapping trees and enjoy the bluebells, primroses, wild daffodils and the eye-catching insects associated with the old trees on the estate. Such a pity that these Guardians of our Heritage can't organise themselves to unlock the Church when the estate is open.
